Workshop Descriptions

Creative Dramatics with Kerri Yim (45 min.): Participate in silly and fun games that utilize voice and body movement that are the building blocks of improvisation and scripted theatre.

Generative Writing with Kerri Yim (bring paper, journal, or notebook): Utilize words and art as creative prompts to kickstart your writing journey. This engaging method often leads to the development of poems and short stories. Time will be allocated for writing and sharing work in class.

Mixed Media Vision Board with Cory Jakl (One long session): Join together in the creative process to answer the question: What had our days come to, and what could we have done? Enjoy creating a beautiful, mixed media vision board in a relaxed, judgment-free, and experiential class!

Percussive Storytelling with Cory Hills: Do you love stories? Do you love drums? Grammy Award-winning musician Cory Hills will bring them together in this exciting workshop! Perfect for all ages, Percussive Storytelling combines vocal storytelling with classical music, transforming everyday stories into sonic gold.

Art Display and Observation with Carol Weiss: Explore Carol Weiss' art and watch her artistic process unfold as she creates a piece live during the event. Witnessing an artist at work offers a fascinating insight into the creative journey.

Readers Theater with Cantor David Shukiar (90 min. Open to anyone over age of 16 due to content): Delve into the world of reader's theater with Cantor David, exploring the script and stories from the Braid's "Crossing Our Red Sea." Rehearse and present a performance to our community before dinner. *The Braid is the preeminent Jewish storytelling organization that creates, curates, produces, and preserves stories deeply rooted in Jewish culture and experiences.*

Dance with Leasa Shukiar of 567 Broadway!: Experience an exhilarating cardio dance workout fused with your favorite Broadway hits! This high-energy, cardio dance workout will leave you shining like the Broadway star you are!

Mask Making with Cantor Natalie Young (2-part workshop. Maximum 30 people per session): Join Cantor Natalie for a two-part workshop where you will first create a mold of your own face using safe materials. After the mask dries, enjoy personalizing it with paint and decorations of your choice. *The whole workshop is a two-hour experience and two experiences are offered. All ages welcome, and helpers for kids are definitely welcome.*
