

In the aftermath of World War II, 1800 Czech scrolls were found.


Some were whole; others were in bits and pieces.



1564 scrolls left Prague in February, 1964 and went to Kent House, Westminster Synagogue in London for repair.

Today, more than 1000 scrolls have new homes.

In October, 1968
Temple Adat Elohim
was given the honor
of becoming the
guardian for this
Holocaust Torah and
carrying on the
tradition of reading
from the Torah.

The Schoolhouse was the first structure built, even before the cemetery.















The sanctuary is now used as a concert hall, and the synagogue itself is owned by The Rabas Gallery.





In 1623 = at last 10 families
1690 = 5 families (38 people)
1702 – 2% Jewish population in Rakovnik
1723 = 5 families
1783 = 9 families
1843 = 14 families
1851 = 30 families
1880 = 360 people (6.8% of the population)
1890 = 375 people (6.6%)
1900 = 332 people (5%)
1930 = 153 people (1.3%)





